The Cycle of the Church Liturgical Year. ADVENT - 22-30 days

Begins the fourth Sunday before Christmas.

Is a time of preparation and waiting for Christmas which recalls the first coming of Jesus.

Is a time for people to look and wait for Jesus' second coming at the end of time.

A season of joyful and spiritual preparation and expectation.

The Advent Wreath: The joyful Sunday on the third week in Advent (known as "Gaudete") is represented by rose (or pink) instead of the penitential purple color. Each night during the third week the mother of the family lights the pink, as well as the two previously burned purple candles, after the following prayer has been said.

Vocations Are Everybody's Business

SACRAMENTAL IMPORTANCE OF HOLY ORDERS



"Ordination" comes from the Latin word *ordinatio*, which means to incorporate someone into an order. It is through this sacrament that one is entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church until the end of time: thus it is the sacrament of apostolic ministry. It includes three degrees: episcopate,

presbyterate, and diaconate.

The rite called "ordination" is a religious and liturgical act which is a consecration, a blessing, or a sacrament. Today the word "ordination" is reserved for the sacramental act which integrates a man into the order of bishops, presbyters, or deacons, and goes beyond a simple election, designation, delegation, or institution by community, for it confers a gift of the Holy Spirit that permits the exercise of a "sacred power" which can come only from Christ himself for his Church.

The laying on of hands by the bishop, with the consecratory prayer, constitutes the visible sign of this ordination. Those who seek priesthood respond generously to God's call using the words of the prophet, "Here I am, send me" (Is 6:8). This call from God can be recognized and understood from the daily signs that disclose his will to those in charge of discerning the vocation of the candidate.

The Sacrament of Holy Orders, like the Sacrament of Baptism and the Sacrament of Confirmation, can only be received once for each level of ordination. Once a man has been ordained, he is spiritually changed, which is the origin of the saying, "Once a priest, always a priest." He can be dispensed of his obligations as a priest (or even forbidden to act as a priest), but he remains a priest forever.

Each level of ordination confers special graces, from the ability to preach, granted to deacons; to the ability to act in the person of Christ to offer the Mass, granted to priests; to a special grace of strength, granted to bishops, which allows him to teach and lead his flock, even to the point of dying as Christ did. https://www.vatican.va
