Commentary for the Readings in the Extraordinary Form: Easter Sunday

"You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, Who was crucified. He has risen, He is not here. . . Go, tell His disciples. . .that He goes before you" (Gospel).

Yes, we, too, searchers
after Christ, now confess we

have found Him. The task before us is to "tell" others of His victory, that all may be "of one mind and heart" (Postcommunion).

Why? Because if Christmas is the loveliest Feast as we behold God *born of Mary* unto man's life, certainly Easter is the greatest as we behold Jesus *born of a tomb* so that man may rise unto God's Life.

Our faith in His Divinity is confirmed because He "overcame death;" our hope is enlivened because He has "opened unto us the Gate of Eternity" (Prayer). Is it any wonder that the "earth trembled. . .when God arose" (Offertory)?

How are we to prepare for our Easter Communion? A Resurrection Day effort to "purge out the old" life for the "new!" How could we be nourished by the "sincerity and truth" of Divine Bread if it were spoiled by the "leaven" of an insincere will, or an untrue mind (Epistle)?
