

Focusing the Gospel

Key words and phrases: This saying is hard, disciples were murmuring, said to the Twelve, Do you want to leave?

To the point: In this Sunday's Gospel it is not the crowd who murmurs but Jesus' own disciples. Only intimacy with Jesus such as the Twelve experienced can bring anyone to stay with Jesus despite the challenge of what he says. When the disciples hear Jesus' words, they

voice what many feel: "This saying is hard." And indeed it is! The choice that confronts those disciples confronts us: will we accept the hard saying? Will we stay with Jesus or not? https://liturgy.slu.edu

Commentary on the Readings for the Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost

"Were not the ten (lepers) made clean? Where are the (other) nine" (Gospel)?



Leprosy, dread disease, meant exile "afar off" as a cast out from home and city. Mankind, rejecting Divine Life, became leprous, cast out from Eden here, from heaven hereafter.

How amazing, then, that God should make a "covenant" with man as though he were His equal (Epistle)! What is this "covenant?" By it God bestows on all "those who believe" in Jesus the right to inherit His Life, promised to Abraham; not to those who look merely to "the Law" of Moses.

Be not content, as were "the nine," with mere health of body but with the "increase of faith, hope and charity" (PRAYER). As with the lepers, so our prayer is: "Have regard, 0 Lord, to Thy covenant, and forsake not . . . Thy poor . . . (do not) cast us off" (Introit).

A new continuing education opportunity for Catechists and all Parishioners! The Diocese of Fairbanks has partnered with Franciscan University of Steubenville's Catechetical Institute called Franciscan at Home. We have joined a network of over 150 dioceses from 27 nations. The Catechetical Institute exists to train and support catechists—priests, deacons, parents, teachers, or laity, whether professional or volunteer. The Institute allows dioceses and parishes to partner with them to offer flexible workshops, ministry certification and on-going formation for those responsible for teaching the faith. The program is being funded through the Office of Faith and Family Formation at the diocese and will not cost the parishes or parishioners to use it. <u>WHO</u>: Catholic Women <u>WHAT</u>: Seven or more women commit a Holy Hour once a week for one specific priest <u>When</u>: Each woman receives a day of the week, and commits to a Holy Hour on that day...FOR ONE WHOLE

WHERE: It is ideal to pray in front of the Blessed sacrament, either in adoration or in front of a Tabernacle but this is not necessary.

Start Praying the Liturgy of the Hours Today

We continue to cover the article on the *Liturgy of the Hours by Fr. Ed Broom, OMV*. Let it become a daily practice that is not abandoned!

- 11. WHAT ELSE? In addition to the Psalms in the Liturgy of the Hours are other elements: An opening hymn, short Biblical Reading, Responsory, Canticle of Zechariah (Morning Prayer); Canticle of Mary (Evening Prayer). Then there are prayers of intercession for the Church and the world at large in both Morning and Evening Prayer. Finally the Lord's Prayer is prayed, followed by a closing blessing.
- 12. PRAYED WITH WHOM? The Liturgy of the Hours can be prayed alone by oneself. God hears our prayers whether we pray individually or collectively. However, the Liturgy of the Hours (sometimes called the Breviary) can be prayed collectively in a group. As a priest and Religious, I regularly pray the Liturgy of the Hours in the Morning with a fellow-priest. When done in a group, the prayer of the Psalms is alternated.
- 13. LAY PARTICIPATION. Over the past years, the Laity have formed groups in which they come together in prayer and in praying the Liturgy of the Hours. At times there is a combination of the Laity praying with priests and Religious. In the monthly publication of the Magnificat there is inserted the Liturgy of the Hours—both Lauds (Morning Prayer) and Vespers (Evening Prayer) 14.
- MODES OF PRAYING THE LITURGY OF THE HOURS. Contemplative monks, as well as Sisters, often have formed the habit of not only praying the Liturgy of the Hours but praying through song or chant. As Saint Augustine asserts: "He who sings, prays twice!" So, it is with the Liturgy of the Hours.
- 15. IN THE CONTEXT OF A MASS. Furthermore, the Liturgy of the Hours can be prayed in the context of the Mass. In fact, the prayer is called The *LITURGY* of The Hours. Thus, it can be inserted within the context of the Liturgy, the Mass itself.
- **16. ELECTRONICALLY**. The Liturgy of the Hours in its totality consists of four big volumes. However, especially for those who travel, one can obtain the App I Breviary and pray the Liturgy of the Hours electronically on your phone or other electronic devices.
