



**Justice Challenge:** Sunday's Gospel tells the story of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31). Ironically, we don't see the rich man doing anything bad—he didn't hit Lazarus or make him

leave or even yell at him. So why did he end up in eternal damnation? It was because he didn't even notice his suffering brother. The rich man was totally oblivious to the needs of Lazarus. Your challenge this week is to increase your awareness. Look at your community, your country, and even your world with new eyes. Who are the invisible poor who need your help? Discuss every evening who you have noticed for the first time. Then, at the end of the week, as a family or an individual choose one action you can do to help a person or a group whom you identified. The help could be a financial donation, direct service, or a form of advocacy on their behalf (e.g., emailing your state legislators to change laws to provide more aid to the homeless or single-parent families or the mentally ill).

# STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

"My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a areat chasm is established..." Luke 16:25-26

When God created the world, He declared that it was good, and He gave it to all mankind for us to enjoy. However, over the years we have created a chasm between those who have great gifts and those who do not. In today's Gospel we see that with our own generosity we must bridge that gap between those who have much and those who have little, or we may find ourselves on the wrong side of the chasm in the next life.

Why DO we call the Rosary a "weapon"? It's a dangerous world out there. Never leave home without your best defense.

It's lightweight, maneuverable, and deadly accurate.

It fits in your pocket, purse, or glovebox.

It performs with pinpoint precision in the most inexperienced hands and is perfectly safe for all ages. It won't ever misfire of jam. It only hurts bad guys. It comes in any color or style you want, and you can outfit it with all kinds of fun accessories.

Nope, it's not a magical revolver. We're talking about something much more effective against the *really* bad guys: demons!



The Rosary has been the weapon of choice for saints, kings, queens, peasants, warrior poets, maidens, missionaries, and misfits for centuries. But why *do* we call this sacramental a "weapon"?

We call it that because it's one of the best defenses against our mortal enemy, the devil. We are truly engaged in a spiritual war at all times, and Satan, as St. Peter says, "prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking some one to devour" (1 Peter 5:8). The devil never sleeps and never tires. He is always plotting our downfall, and we've got to be on the offensive against him if we are to spiritually survive and make it to heaven.

If we're going up against the devil, we'd best be fighting under the banner of Our Lady. The devil fears her like he fears no one else. She is like "an army set in battle array" (Song of Songs 6:10) against the forces of evil. She has given her warriors a special weapon for the fight, and they carry her Rosary like a sword at their side.

In fact, those in religious life carry their rosaries on the left side, hanging from their belt, because this is the traditional place for a sword!

# **Everyday Stewardship** Fixing the Scales



Most people don't intend on being selfish. The reality of selfishness usually lies in the grey shades of our decisionmaking. We would never go out of our way to kick a homeless person begging by the highway exit. We would never steal money from our parish collection plate.

But would we drive past the homeless person without even extending a thought or a prayer toward his need? Would we justify stinginess in time, talent, and treasure because of our own comfort? We all have been guilty of transgressions such as these in the past. We will fall again in the future.

Most of the evil in this world can be traced back to a feeling of entitlement that lurks deep within each of us — a frantic concern for our own good that we find difficult to shake. The same instinct that compelled Eve to reach for the fruit that would give her the knowledge of good and evil still compels people to focus on what they are owed, on what they have "earned," on what they have "coming to them." We are so tempted to fix the scales. We are so tempted to keep score.

We would do well to remember that our God is not a God who keeps score. He is not a God who acts entitled or who tacks on extra dues, taking as much as He can get. He is a God who seats the lowly with princes. He is a God who seeks avenues for reconciliation and mercy.
