What are the traditional intentions of the Holy Father?

We pray for them often—but what exactly are the intentions of the Holy Father?

You probably pray for the "intentions of the Holy Father" often—at the end of the Rosary, while praying the Morning Offering, even during Mass. Praying for these intentions is one of the requirements for gaining a plenary indulgence. But what are these intentions? Are they something specific?



The "intentions of the Holy Father" that we pray for as a part of various devotions are not only his personal or monthly intentions— though we include these too. But we also pray for specific, objective intentions directly related to the well-being of the Church and her faithful. In fact, the Church has established six traditional intentions of the Holy Father (some sources you may read list four or five):

- 1. The Exaltation of the Church
- 2. The Propagation of the Faith
- 3. The Extirpation of Heresy
- 4. The Conversion of Sinners
- 5. The Concord between Christian Princes
- 6. The Further Welfare of the Christian People

The Church is under attack, both from external and internal forces, and it is of the utmost importance that we continue to steadfastly pray for her and our Church leaders. Since the Pope is our leader here on earth, his intentions are intertwined with the intentions of the whole Church. Let us not abandon our Church! May we be renewed in our urgency to pray for our Holy Father and his intentions!

A powerful resource for praying for the Church and the Holy Father is the traditional compilation of prayers, the Raccolta, which beautifully articulates the Pope's six intentions. Revised under Pope Pius XII, this official collection (or "raccolta" in Italian) of the Church's prayers and devotions was published in English in 1957. The 800+ prayers of the Raccolta touch practically every spiritual and physical need, and every personal and societal hope. Who Do You Say That I Am?



I once knew a very devout woman whose adult godchild had fallen away from the practice of the faith. This godchild still believed in God, and even felt a sense of belonging in the Church. He was a good and kind person. But poor catechesis and a society that confuses pleasure with joy had left him lax in practice, without an appreciation of the sacraments. He was making choices that threatened his soul.

His godmother wanted more for him. She planned to speak with him about his life, hoping to encourage him to return to the practice of the faith. She knew that, when she brought this up, he would reply that it wasn't important to attend Mass or to receive the Eucharist, that was all just "extra."

She told me that she was going to begin their conversation by asking him the question Jesus poses to Peter in Matthew 16:15 — the critical question in all our lives, the question whose answer will define what we become in this world and the next.

Her godson knew the answer. She was confident, unshakably, that he did. He may have forgotten it or ignored it. He may have tried to convince himself he wasn't entirely sure. He may have refused to give an answer. But he knew it. He knew the answer.

There is a reason that, after Peter's response, Jesus gives him the keys to the kingdom of heaven.

"Who do you say that I am?"

Let our whole lives be our answer.
